Bishop: Blessèd is our God always, now and ever and unto ages of ages.



Choir: God is the Lord...


Deacon: The stone which the builders rejected has become the

Choir: God is the Lord... (and then immediately)








Deacon: Wisdom!

Reader: Brethren, we know that all creation groans and travails in pain until now. And not only creation, but we ourselves who have the first fruits of the Spirit groan within ourselves, waiting for the adoption as sons, the redemption of our body. For in hope were we saved. But hope that is seen is not hope. For how can a man hope for what he sees? But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience. Likewise the Spirit also helps our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but the Spirit Himself intercedes for us with unutterable groanings. And He who searches the hearts knows what the Spirit desires, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God.


Deacon: Wisdom! Let us attend! Let us hear the Holy Gospel.

But and if that evil servant shall say in his heart, My lord delays his coming; And shall begin to abuse his fellow servants, and to eat and drink with the drunken; The lord of that servant shall come in a day when he looks not for him, and in an hour that he is not aware of, And shall cut him asunder, and appoint him his portion with the hypocrites: there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth.

Deacon: Again we pray Thee, O Lord, who dost oppose the works of the proud, do Thou reform the works of our hands that misfortune and affliction be not visited back upon us and bring us to ruin, but look upon our humility and send down grace and peace, we entreat Thee, harken in Thy compassion and have mercy.

Deacon: Again we pray Thee, O Lord, let not Thy creation suffer for the sake of our intemperance and lawlessness, but let it be preserved unharmed from all adverse insidiousness, we entreat Thee, harken and have mercy.




Priest: Most holy Theotokos, save us!
